

SCONE GOLF REPORT for May 21, 2015

“Adam Moore top score”

Last Saturday and Sunday Scone golfers competed in the 18 Hole Stableford combined competition. Saturday was windy and the scores reflected the conditions except for visitor Peter Reid who had 40 points. On Sunday Adam Moore had the best round of the weekend with 43 points to win A Grade. B Grade was won by Tim Smith with 36 points and C Grade by Peter Reid. The NTP's were won with two fine shots, on the 2nd /11th Geoff Barton's ball finished 1.29 metres from the hole, whilst on the 8th / 17th Scott Reid was marginally closer at 1.02 metres. Ball winners were Adam Moore 43, Peter Reid 40, Tim Smith 36, Jake Teague 35, Geoff Barton 34, Gary Barton 33, Paul Smart 33, David Bradshaw 31 and Ross Banks 31 on a countback.

Next Saturday an 18 Hole 2B and Individual Stableford will be played for the A.E. Shaddock Memorial Day for the Noel Kelly and Charlie Manning Trophy. Muree visited to play the third round of the Masters Pennant last Sunday and with a very strong team were too good for the locals winning 5 and a 1/2 to 2. Terry Winser recorded a win 1 up, with Paul Smart and Steve Morse both having squares. Round 4 will be played on May 31 at Scone against Tanilba Bay.

The HRDGA four person Mixed Ambrose at Aberdeen on Sunday May 24 will have a couple of local teams entered. The men's Sandgreens Championships at Murrurundi on Sunday May 31 is still open for entries and they can be made on line on the HRDGA new website.

The star of the day was Marie Murray who had 68 nett to win the medals, the Melanie's Jewellers Trophy and receive a deserved handicap adjustment.
